January:

ReMax Quest for Excellence Program – This bursary recognizes leadership and community contributions of Western Canadian students. Grade 12 students can earn a \$1000 bursary to be used towards further education. Students must write an essay on one of the following topics: leadership, sports, performing arts, technology or trades, fine arts, or community/volunteer service. See website for complete details.

Value - \$1000 (16 bursaries are awarded in Western Canada)

Belcourt Brosseau Métis Awards - Applicants must be Métis, demonstrate financial need and intend to pursue a qualified program. Awards are based on a holistic assessment of financial need, connection to the Métis community and other circumstances. Priority will be given to full-time students entering the first year of their program, but awards are open to students in all years of study. A wide range of academic and vocational programs and institutions in Alberta are funded. See website for complete details.

Value ranges from \$2,000 - \$7,000.

The Leonard Foundation Scholarship – This scholarship is available to students who can demonstrate financial need and are enrolling full time in an undergraduate degree program in Canada. Successful applicants are expected to obtain employment during their free time to help with their education costs and they must participate in athletic, fitness or military activities. Value - \$1,000 - \$1,500 (140 awarded annually)
