Students can be assigned to DLR by their teachers and/or Grade Coordinator for a variety of things including missed assignments or exams, skipping class, etc.



Attendance Pyramid

Student absences and lates combined with a failure to keep up with the work does not result in successful learning. As such, SGCHS utilizes the following Attendance Pyramid to ensure the best opportunity for success.



Students who arrive to class/school 30 minutes or more after the bell will be marked absent. However, it is expected that students will be in class to avoid falling behind in their studies. The students who arrive late to class are required to attend the scheduled class for the remainder of the block. Only students who are arriving late for class because of an appointment with an administrator/counselor will be provided with an admittance slip.

Note: Where required SGCHS will report attendance to outside agencies i.e.: Probation Officer, Social Services, Child Welfare, Student Finance, Provincial Attendance Board, etc.
